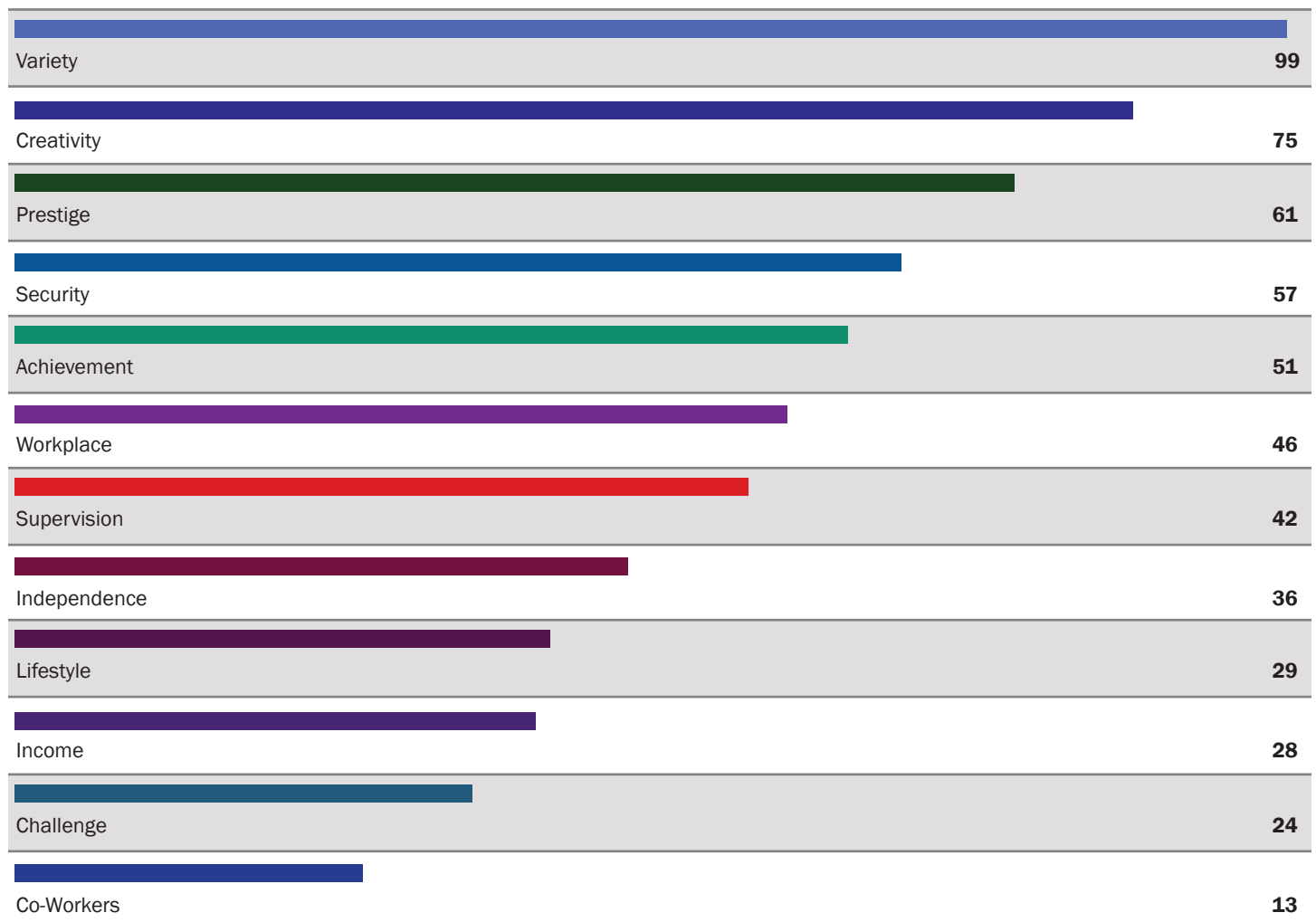

### Work Values

This assessment measures how important certain characteristics will be in your future career. These characteristics will likely play a role in how satisfied you are in that job. Each occupation has characteristics that appeal to some people more than to others. These characteristics may include high pay, people you enjoy working with, and a job that makes you feel important. Your preferences for these characteristics are called work values.

The work value most important to you is the one with the longest bar. The work value least important to you is the one with the shortest bar. The number to the right of the bar tells you how important the work value is to you as compared to others. For example, if the number to the right of the bar is a 97, it means that 97 percent of students your age value that work characteristic less than you do. Even though this might be important information, pay particular attention to how **you** ranked these work values.
